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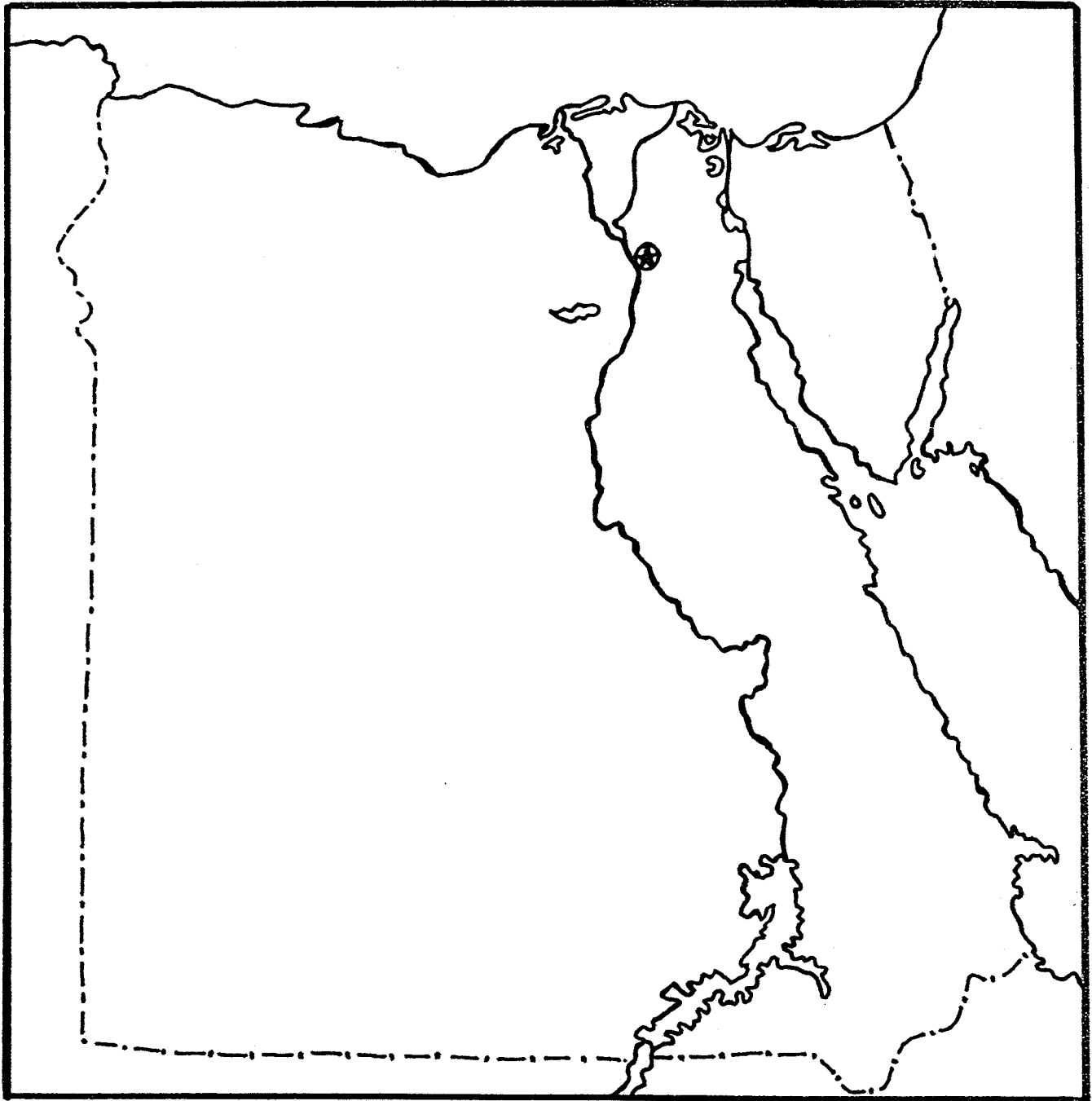
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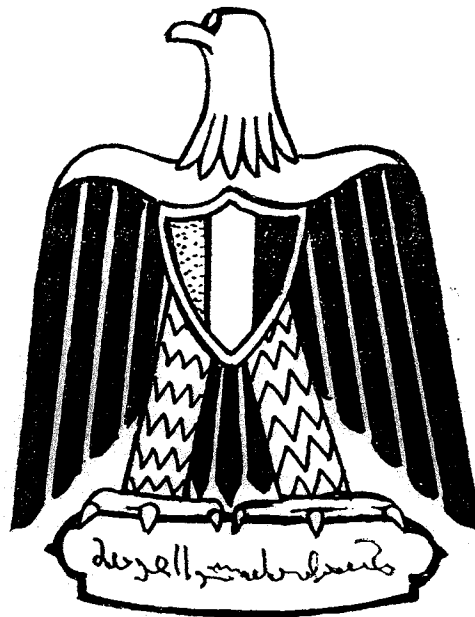
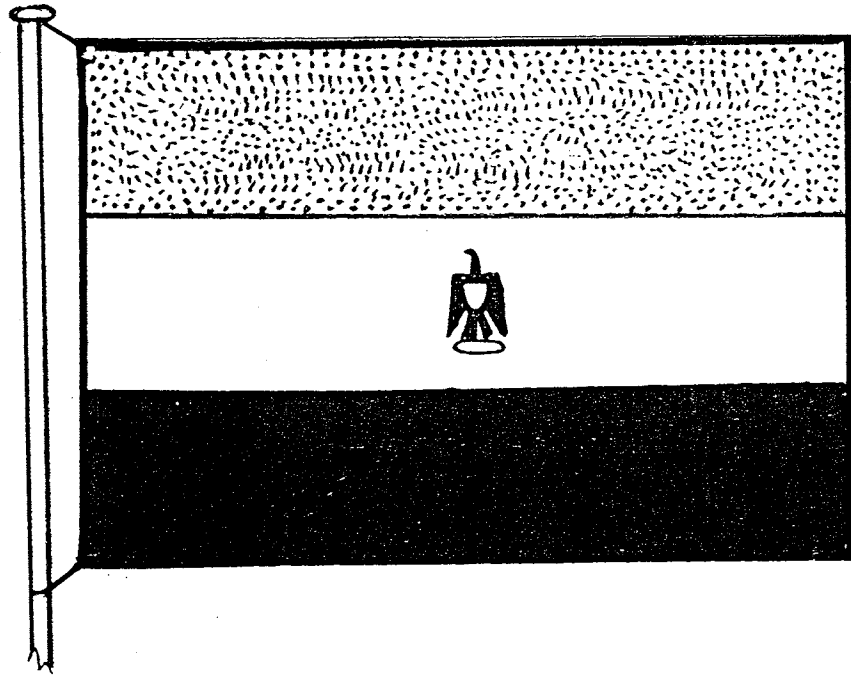
# Egypt - Past and Present

## **This Picture collection could be used in the following ways:**

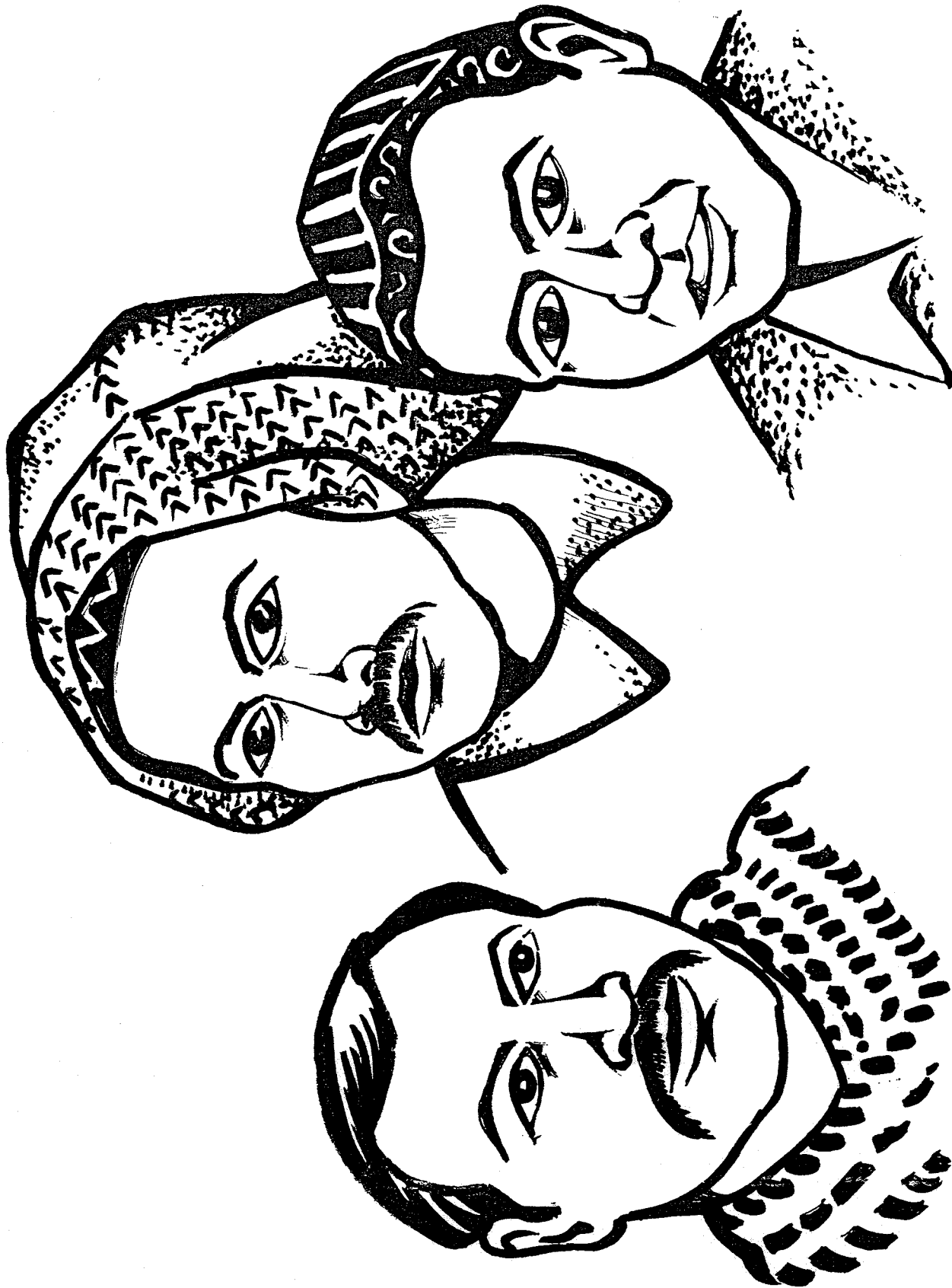
1. The illustrations could be colored, mounted and laminated and used to develop a bulletin board display on Ancient Egypt or present day Egypt.
2. This picture collection could be used in conjunction with the units called Ancient Egypt (SSF1-18 or OTM-618) and Egyptians Today and Yesterday (SSF1-28 or OTM-628) published by S&S Learning Materials.
3. Students could use the individual illustrations for project work or research activities.
4. The illustrations could be used to design activity cards blanks for activity centers.
5. Make up riddles about the illustrations and have the students locate the correct one. The students could make up riddles as well.
6. Divide your class into groups. Give each group an illustration. Have the group find out five interesting facts about it. This could be done as a co-operative learning exercise.
7. Distribute the illustrations amongst your students. Have each student reasearch the illustration and make an oral report to the class.
8. Descriptive paragraphs could be written about each illustration. This is a good way to measure your students' ability to note details and use of descriptive vocabulary.
9. Blow up the illustrations using an opaque projector to make large wall hangings for the students to paint.
10. Reduce the illustrations to one quarter the size. Mount them on a sturdy backing and laminate them. Make up name cards to go with the illustrations. Use the cards for a word/picture matching game. Store the cards in an envelope.
