Many years ago the only people who lived in Canada were the Native People and the Inuit. They hunted and fished for their food.

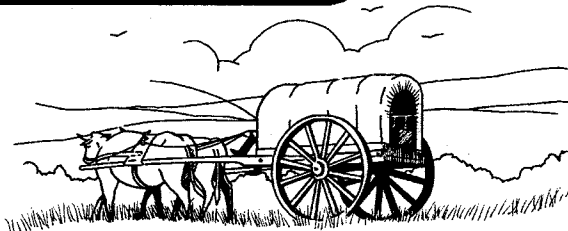
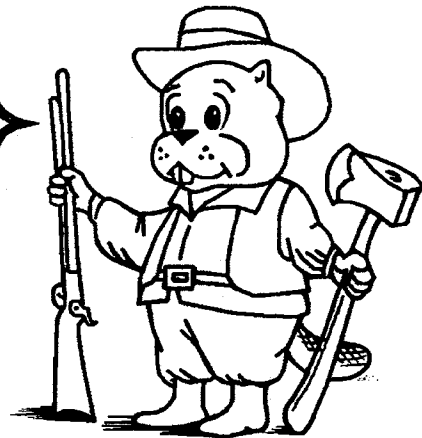
