





"Still want to clean her poop?" her brother asked.


Tessa wasn't sure anymore. She knew her grandpa adored kittens. Maybe Grandpa could adopt Mirabel, and she could just visit!


Just then, Mirabel leaped toward Tessa and curled up in her lap. She rested her Furry head on Tessa's knee and purred.

"Yes," Tessa decided, then and there. "I still want to feed her and chase her and clean her poop!"






