★Avril Lavigne★

vril Ramona
Lavigne is a world famous
Canadian singer and songwriter
who is also well known for her
"skater punk" persona. She rose
to fame at the age of 18 with
her single called "Complicated",
in the spring of 2002. It scaled
the charts across the continent
and by the summer, the track

had reached the top spot among Canadian singles. The popularity of "Complicated" paved the way for the success of Avril's first full-length CD, "Let Go".

Avril was born in Belleville, Ontario on September 27, 1984 to devout Christian parents of French-Canadian descent. When Avril was five years old, her parents moved to a small nearby town called Napanee and it is here where she grew up and attended church and school. At the age of two, Avril's ability to sing was noticed by her mother during church services when she sang the hymns along with her and the congregation.

During her early years, she sang in the local church choir and at the age of ten she began singing country music in competitions at local fairgrounds. Three years later, her vocal talent won her the grand prize in a radio station contest which was a trip to Ottawa to perform a duet in a concert with another famous Canadian country music star, Shania Twain.

By the time Avril reached high school, she began sending videotapes of her stage performances to labels and management companies throughout North America. She was discovered by her first professional manager while singing at a Chapters bookstore in Kingston, Ontario. By the age of sixteen, she was signed by Arista Records which arranged for her to fly to New York City to meet other songwriters and begin working on a demo tape. The representatives of Arista Records were

so impressed with her voice, they immediately signed Avril to a contract at the age of sixteen.

Avril briefly returned to Canada, collected her belongings and then returned to Manhattan to begin her professional career, accompanied by

her older brother Matt as an escort. Avril has always approached life with an independent attitude of always doing her own thing and when she discovered she was signed to Arista as strictly a vocalist, she refused to sing songs written by someone else. She insisted on having a hand in the writing process. Avril and the New York songwriters did not work well together, so she left New York and went to Los Angeles. It was here on the West Coast that she met producer and songwriter Cliff Magness and developed a good working rapport. Together they worked on Avril's debut album.

In 2002, Avril was named "Best New Artist at the MTV Video Music Awards and at the 2003 Juno Awards she had six nominations and won four Junos. She has also been nominated for eight Grammy Awards but has not won any to date. In February 2004, Avril begin dating fellow Canadian singer Deryck Whibley, the lead singer/guitarist of the pop punk band Sum 41. On June 27, 2005, Deryck proposed to Avril during a gondola ride in Venice and they were married at a private estate in California on July 15, 2006

Avril exhibits musical skills that are far greater than many of her peers. She writes her own songs, plays guitar exceptionally well and her voice displays a very versatile style and range. She is truly a rare talent and a complicated young woman.*

A Young Ingénue

In June 1, 1974 at Riverside
Hospital in Ottawa, Ontario, Alanis Nadine
Morissette and her twin brother Wade were
born. The proud parents were Alan Richard
Morissette of French-Canadian descent and
Georgia Mary Ann Feurstein of Hungarian
descent. Alanis also has an older brother
named Chad. Alanis is known as a rock
artist, singer, songwriter, actress and a
record producer. She plays the guitar, flute,
keyboards, and harmonica as well as being a
superb vocalist.

At the age of six, Alanis began playing the piano and it was then that she realized she wanted to express herself through the arts. At nine, she was writing and composing her own songs. She sent her first song called "Fate Stay With Me" to a local musician, Lindsay Morgan, who took her on as his protégé.

In 1986, at the age of 10, Alanis had her first acting job. She performed in five episodes of the children's television show "You Can't Do That on Television". The money that she made from the show she used to release her first song as a single. Alanis also performed in Ottawa's Tulip Festival and several other singing gigs such as singing the national anthem at sporting events and trying out on the popular American talent show "Star Search."

When Alanis was 14, she was signed to MCA/Canada and her first album, "Alanis," was made. While in high school, Alanis won a platinum album and a Juno Award for Most Promising Female Vocalist. Between the ages of 14 to 18, Alanis suffered from anorexia and bulimia nervosa during the making of her first album due to professional pressure and managerial demands. The studio felt that she couldn't be successful if she was fat and as a result she lived on a diet of carrots, black coffee and Melba toast. Eventually, she began therapy which was a long process to reprogram her brain.



Alanis' second album, "Now is the Time," was not as successful and failed commercially. Her contract with MCA/Canada was over and she did not have someone to publish and produce her music.

In 1993, after graduating from high school, Alanis moved to Toronto to work with other songwriters in order to get her career back on track, but the results were not successful. Even a trip to Nashville, Tennesee, proved fruitless. Finally she went to Los Angeles and found a writer named Glen Ballard who encouraged her to express her emotions in her songs. Her third album, "Jagged Little Pill," was written and recorded in the spring of 1995 and she signed a deal with Madonna's Maverick Records. "Jagged Little Pill" has sold 30 million copies around the world turning it into the highest selling female album and the third highest selling album of all time.

During her busy career, Alanis has written many songs, recorded numerous albums, and performed in ten world tours. She has won seven Grammys and 12 Juno awards to honour her vocal and song writing ability. Alanis' aggressive and genuine lyrics have shown people everywhere that they too can overcome adversity and heartbreak in order to soar to great heights.*
