One of Canada's Treasures

Sarah Polley

Sarah Polley is a Canadian actress, singer, screenwriter, and director. She is the youngest of five children and was born on January 8, 1979 in Toronto, Ontario into a show business family. Her mother, Diane Polley, was also an actress and casting director. Her father, Michael Polley, is a British actor and an insurance agent. Her older brother Mark is an actor and her second brother John is a casting director and producer.



Sarah's acting career began at the age of four, due to her mother's connections and her persistence to act. In 1985, Sarah played the role of Molly in the Disney film One Magic Christmas. In 1988, at the age of eight, Sarah was cast in the title role in the television series Ramona, which was based on Beverly Cleary's books. The series only lasted one season. As a child actress, her career took a dramatic change in 1990 when she was cast as the Cockney orphan Jody Turner in Lantern Hill, a television film. The film was based on the book written by Lucy Maud Montgomery. Sarah's efforts were rewarded with a Gemini Award in 1992. During the same year, Sarah had the opportunity to be in the public eye by appearing as Sara Stanley on the popular CBC television series Road to Avonlea. This series made her famous and financially independent and she was loved and adored by thousands of Canadian fans.

When Sara was 11, tragedy struck her family. Her mother, Diane Polley, died from cancer. This tragic event paralleled the life of the character Sara Stanley, who she was playing in the Road to Avonlea. Her mother's death made a great impact on her personal life. Being extremely intelligent and politically progressive, Sarah rebelled against the Americanization of the series when it was picked up by the Disney Channel. When Sara was 12, she attended an awards ceremony wearing a peace sign in protest of the first Gulf War. She was asked to remove it by Disney officials and she refused. Her relationship with Disney was not the same after the incident and she left Road to Avonlea in 1994. Sarah has often stated that she lost her childhood to her acting career. Although she does not blame her parents, she has said during interviews that she would never let any of her children act at an early age.

During her teens, Sarah attended the Subway Academy II, which was then called Earl Haig Secondary School. She became politically active, became a prominent member of the New Democratic Party, and dropped out of school before graduating. During a political protest at Queen's Park in Toronto in 1995, Sarah lost several back teeth during a clash between the police and the protesters.

In 1996, Sara appeared as Lily on the CBC television series, *Straight Up.* It ran for two seasons and she won the Gemini Award for Best Performance in a Children's Series. Her next role was as Nicolle Burnelli, a teenager who was injured in a school bus accident, in the film *The Sweet Hereafter*. This role brought her attention from American and Canadian critics and was her breakthrough into adult roles.

In 1999, Sarah played a young woman named Harper who comes from a well-to-do family in the film *Guinevere*. She finds life boring and unfulfilling, and does not want to attend university. This film brought Sarah unwanted attention and fame, which was something she dislikes intensely, as she is an extremely private person. Sarah often rebels against the expected ways the media and critics feel one should accept celebrity and fame. As a result, she dropped out of the movie *Almost Famous* which was to make her a mainstream star in the United States and returned to Canada to make less money to do the film *The Law of Enclosures* in 2000.

For a period of time, Sarah took a wide variety of parts in independent films. Her choice of roles helped her to focus on the art of her craft and she also wanted to be in films with a social importance.

Canada's Anne Shirley

egan Follows won the hearts of thousands in her role as the red-haired, freckled-faced orphan named Anne Shirley in the television series *Anne of Green Gables*. This talkative 11 year old, with an active imagination, impressive vocabulary, and a quick temper filled Marilla and Mathew Cuthbert's lives with a wide variety of events and adventure. Megan Elizabeth Laura Diana Follows



was born on March 14, 1968 in Toronto, Canada. She was the last child of Ted Follows, a famous Canadian theatre actor and director, and Dawn Greenhalgh, an actress. Her siblings Laurence, Edwina, and Samantha Follows, are also actors. Megan began acting as a toddler with her siblings as their parents were involved with the establishment of Canada's summer theatre.

Megan's acting career began at the age of three doing commercials. When she was 11 years old, she had her first break in the television series *Matt and Jenny*. At 12, she played the youngest daughter in the series *The Baxters*. Megan also had guest roles on a variety of television shows such as *Hangin' In* and *The Littlest Hobo*. In time, producers in the United States began to hear about Canada's rising star and when she was 14, Megan was invited to audition for the most famous television producer, Norman Lear. Her audition gave her American exposure and began her cross-border career which continues today.

Megan played the lead in many Canadian specials such as Jen's Place, Hockey Night, and Boys and Girls. During the filming of Hockey Night, Megan auditioned for the series Anne of Green Gables. Her first audition was not verv successful and the producer decided to search across Canada for a young girl to play the part. After auditioning over 3,000 young girls and not finding a candidate to play the role, the producer decided to audition Megan again. This audition was successful and Megan went on to make the role her own. The series received rave reviews and Megan won the Gemini Award for Best Performance by an Actress. Anne of Green Gables was one of the most successful Canadian shows ever produced and has played in more than 145 countries.

During her teen years, she appeared in the film *Stacking*, a special called *Seasonal Differences*, and the television movie *Sin of Innocence*. In 1986, she returned to Canada to play the role of Anne Shirley in the *Anne of Green Gables - The Sequel* often referred to as *Ann of Avonlea*. It became the highest rated miniseries ever to be seen on television in Canada.

While working on the movie *Deep Sleep*, Megan met and began to date Christopher David Porter who was originally from Chester, Nova Scotia. They were married in the oldest chapel in Las Vegas on April 27, 1991. During the 1990s, Megan decided to slow down and focus on becoming a Shakespearean actor, as well as a new mother. Her first child, Lyla Ann, was born in 1992, and Russell Porter-Follows was born in 1995. After the birth of her daughter, Megan got the role she had always dreamed of playing. She was to star in Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet* at Canada's Stratford Festival. Shortly after the birth of their second child, Megan and Christopher divorced.

For a few years, Megan took on leading roles in various plays produced by the Toronto-based Soulpepper Theatre Company. She has performed in plays such as *A Doll's House*, *Fool for Love*, *The Real Things*, *Top Girls*, *Three Sisters*, and with her real mother, Dawn Greenhalgh in *Drama' Night, Mother*.

Today, Megan is happily married to fellow actor Stuart Hughes, who is a founding member of the Soulpepper Theatre Company. They divide their time with their children between their homes in Los Angeles and Canada. Megan will always be Anne Shirley in the hearts and memories of Canadians across Canada. •
